

#### AG: So tell me how did you get into dancing?

DM: I met a girl. She was going to Stratford Circus Arts Centre and invited me along. I just thought "I need to impress her!" There was a dance off, and I tried to do something to make people laugh and it worked.

I went to Pineapple Studios which I found quite hard and ended up walking out. There was a group of guys outside doing popping, man when I saw these guys, the moves! That was the moment that changed my whole life forever. I would travel to Pineapple every Saturday to practise with these guys.

#### AG: What came after Pineapple Studios?

DM: I met another girl, and she invited me to a contemporary dance class. I went along and they were like you're a dancer? And I was like yeah mate I've got a name for myself. And he said can you touch your toes? I couldn't.... I was told I needed to go to a dance school. Can you imagine me telling my mum and dad I'm going to a dance school?!

#### AG: And did you go to the audition?

DM: Yeah I went to audition at Lewisham College. I did my first ballet, contemporary and jazz classes. But then we came to improv. I knew how to do that, I did it every day with the guys who did popping. They put on a funk track and I was just dancing, everyone was looking at me! They offered me a place that day. But I had to quit my job, I thought who's going to pay for this! I had no money man, those 2 years were the hardest years of my life. But it paid off, I went to The Place to do contemporary dance, and still travelling all over to popping competitions. Then Russell Maliphant took me out of The Place to train with his company.

# AG: Tell me about that! That's crazy. How did that feel?

DM: My popping crew did Breakin' Convention where I met Jonzi D, he asked me to do 'Freestyle Forum' which is where Russell found me. I didn't know who he was! I told The Place I'd been asked to join this company and they were like, you worked so hard to get here so you should stay until the end. Then I said it's Russell Maliphant's company. He sat me down and said you know who he is right? You should go! So I did.


#### AG: How did Fiyah House come about?

DM: My crew also practised at Russell's studio, and our classes would get 30-40 people as well which is how Fiyah House sort of started. I used to pick up the kids and bring them to the class. It's been a discipline to stop them getting into trouble. The crew itself is a collective of people who are my family, now you come to Fiyah House it's really big. People travel all over the world to come to us!

# AG: And that's what you're bringing up to Salford?

DM: Yeah, a lot of guys travel from Manchester to London just for that Friday. So it's an opportunity to bring it closer to them.

Dickson Mbi is bringing his piece 'Duende' to The Lowry as part of 'An Evening with Dickson Mbi and Friends' in February, along with his 'Friday Fiyah House' workshop.

A theatre might not seem the most obvious site for experimental electronic music but The Lowry is fast becoming known for hosting for some of the world's greatest electronic artists.

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We have showcased international artists such as Dasha Rush, Herman Kolgen, Andrea Parker and most recently DRIFT (Manchester's own underground network of artists, musicians and performers).

Producing electronic music and rhythms that would not be out of place in an warehouse club, these creative innovators mix and merge sound with spectacular digital artwork that is generated by and responds to the music.

Electro-composer Shiva Feshareki, arrives fresh from her success at the BBC Proms and wielding multiple awards including the Women Make Music PRS Award and BBC/Guardian Young Composer of the Year. This hot-shot music entrepreneur will give us an experimental fusion of sonic sampling using classic, club and dance influences, accompanied by stunning visuals.

A sell-out hit on their last visit, their new show, 'The Isle of Brimsker', is a tale of a lonely lighthouse keeper and her surprise visitor.

imitating the dog have been making ground-breaking work for theatres, outdoor festivals and other spaces for 20 years. Their work has been seen across the world by hundreds of thousands of people. So they must be doing something right!

What's their secret? Well, as a company they are most interested in telling stories. So nothing new there, that is after all the role of theatre! What really makes the company special is their ability to mix live performance with film and digital technology to create beautiful, memorable moments of cinematic genius. Their work is fresh and often surprising; ranging from adaptations of classic novels or films, to new, devised works.

Their last visit to The Lowry saw them bring Hemmingway's 'Farewell to Arms' to life using projection mapping, live relay film and original music.

This spring they return with 'Heart of Darkness', Joseph Conrad's extraordinary, influentialnovel. This bold re-telling will use imitating the dog's trademark digital technology as the story unfolds like an animated graphic novel on hanging projection screens above the performer's heads.

The story begins as Conrad's story; of the voyage into the perilous unknown. But as we continue the journey, it becomes our story, exposing the dehumanisation that paved the way for the horrors of the 20th century, and countless horrors yet to come.

You will come away feeling provoked, dazzled and moved. That is their secret.

# THE MUSIC

A quirky, live ensemble of sax, trombone, theremin, keyboard, and percussion along with a live singer, play Ethan Iverson's arrangements of Beatles songs, and imaginative original compositions influenced by the Fab Four. From an easy, light piece showcasing the harpsichord to a down and dirty jazzy number this ensemble can switch the mood of the dance in an instant. Whilst you may find it a little difficult to clap along to 'When I'm 64' (you'll know what we mean when you hear it!) you'll easily be able to hum along to 'Penny Lane' if you feel so inclined.

# **E** DANCING

The dancers move seamlessly between the vignettes Mark Morris has choreographed, going from freeing leaps across the stage, to intimate duets, to 60s throwback moves. Humour, emotion and pure joy all feature in the individual pieces, with dancers presenting themselves as the cover stars of the album, an almost silent film like touching rendition of 'A Day In The Life', and a playful piece to 'With a Little Help From My Friends'. Mark Morris doesn't make you feel like you have to 'get' dance to enjoy his whimsical tribute.

# THE COSTUMES

Bright is the first word that springs to mind when you see Elizabeth Kurtzman's costumes. A conscious decision was made to stay away from the iconic marching band costumes and flower power hippie style but you will see moddish 60s silhouettes, clashing psychedelic colours and patterns, suits and miniskirts and some beautiful checked coats...and guite a few pairs of sunglasses! The dancers really do look incredible in her creations!

### THE FEELING

Beatles fan or dance fan 'Pepperland' is a wonderful and surprising show that will make you grin from ear to ear. We bet you'll be humming the songs old and new for a few days after, or even trying out a few moves in your kitchen!

# WAYNE MCGREGOR: AUTOBIOGRAPHY

Born in 1970, this award winning Stockport-born artist, known for his experimentation and collaboration with technology and science, has been front and centre of cutting-edge contemporary arts for over 25 years.

At the tender age of 22, McGregor founded Random Dance (now known as Studio Wayne McGregor) as a means of showcasing his creative talents in dance and beyond to the world. In 2018 Company Wayne McGregor celebrates its 25th year. This ensemble of ten world-class dancers is the crucible for McGregor's most experimental work and has over 30 productions under its belt.

McGregor's work has earned him a multitude of awards (four Critics' Circle Awards, two Time Out Awards, two South Bank Show Awards, two Olivier Awards, two Golden Mask awards... to name a few!) In 2011 McGregor was awarded a CBE for Services to Dance.

In Company Wayne McGregor's 'Autobiography' he once again turns to science for inspiration as he looks at memory and his own genetics to look at the human body as a living archive.



# RUSSELL MALIPHANT: SILENT LINES

'I'd hope there is something about the relationship between the people in my pieces that's more important than technique. There is a trust between them — there has to be, given what they're asked to do.' RUSSELL MALIPHANT. 2003.

Russell Maliphant started out in the trade, training at the Royal Ballet School. However the world of classical ballet was not for him and he left to go solo.

As a performer he shot to fame, dancing with some of the world's top companies and choreographers, such as DV8, Michael Clark, Rosemary Butcher and Laurie Booth. Turning his hand to choreography, in 1994 he founded the aptly named 'Russell Maliphant Company'. Their success has been seismic, (two Olivier Awards, two South Bank Show awards and three Critics' Circle National Dance awards... noticing a pattern here?) and that's not mentioning his international accolades...

In their own words, the company's work is 'characterised by a unique approach to flow and energy and an ongoing exploration of the relationship between movement, light and music'.

Recently Maliphant was named one of London's Most Influential People (something he shares with our Wayne).

This summer The Lowry presents his new work 'Silent Lines' — a visually breathtaking combination of movement, video animation and lighting.
