This lesson will support your children to write the endings to their own pieces of creative writing.



Coordinating Conjunctions

Use a coordinating conjunction, to make these sentences longer and more interesting.

The main ones are 'and,' 'but' and 'or.'





Sentence Starters

A sentence starter begins a sentence.

Different types of writing need different sentence starters.
Starting our sentences in different ways
makes our writing more interesting.



Over the last few lessons, you have written the beginning and middle of your creative writing.









In pairs check your story so far.

Read it out loud.


What can you change or improve to make your writing better?


Give each other feedback.
